Tangrams

This is a fun way to make art using the shapes we have learned about in Nursery! We will also explore different artists and their work.

What you need:


Card and/or paper

Pens/pencils


Scissors

Your imagination


Draw and cut some shapes: circles, squares, rectangles or any other shapes you can think of!



Arrange your shapes to create a picture, then using a pencil to draw around them.



Add the details and colours to your picture. You can cut and use smaller shapes for the details.



How many shapes can you count in your picture? Can you name them?

Variation: You could use glue to stick your shapes on the paper. Why don't you try both and compare the differences in the pictures? Which kind of picture is your favourite and why?

Day 1 – a house

Day 2 – an animal

Day 3 – a boat

Day 4 – a tree

Day 5 – big challenge: a village.
