- 6. Better siting of 3 apple trees
- 7. When the time is suitable, resuming in school activities such as cooking with the p6s or planting with the Nursery
- 8. Living fence
- 9. Sign making with Edinburgh Tool Library for p7s
- 10. Project report / project sustainability / project budget
- 11. Compost / Gardening waste materials
- 12. Investigating proper arrangements to pass on surplus grown food (and surplus food from Parent Council/Friends @ Broughton events) for charitable uses
- **13. School partnership with Mboreni Primary School in Tanzania** investigating their possible interest in growing and cooking
- 14. Looking for other contacts with an interest in Growing and Cooking
