Things to remember

- As some of you may have noticed, there is a lot of traffic around our school.
- As a result of this, we need to be  very careful when near roads and when crossing them.
- Here are a couple of helpful tips to keep you safe!

1. Always **THINK**

- Where is the safest place for you to cross?
- At Broughton we have different areas that we can cross safely. Usually our lollipop people are there to help you cross safely. Keep an eye out for them.



2. KNOW your signals

- There are a few sets of traffic lights around our school. It is important we understand what all of the signals mean so we can cross the road safely.

- At the front of our school we have traffic lights to help us cross safely. Broughton Road is a very busy road so please always wait for the green man shown below. Never cross when the red man can be seen.



Dark mornings and dark evenings

- In October when the clocks go back you begin to notice it gets darker much earlier than normal. It can be very difficult for cars to see you and many people get hurt on the roads at this time of year because they cannot be seen.



Be bright, be seen

- Being seen when you are near roads is VERY important.
- Always wear light or bright-coloured clothing, even in the daytime. Help the car drivers to spot you!
