Bloom's Taxonomy Questions for Reading

REMEMBERING

- 1. What are the main events in the story?
- 2. Where and when is the story set?
- 3. Who are the main characters in the story?
- 4. What other characters or significant objects feature in the story?

COMPREHENSION

- 1. Explain the title of the story (and any chapter titles).
- 2. What genre (kind) of story is this? How do you know?
- 3. In what ways is the story similar to another story you have read?
- 4. Draw a story map or time line to show what happens in the book.

APPLYING

- Is there anyone you know or have read about who is like a character in the story?
- 2. If you were the main character in the story what would you have done differently?
- 3. What questions would you ask the main character if you met them?
- 4. What advice would you give one of the characters if you met them?

ANALYSING

- 1. Is the story told chronologically or does it move forwards and backwards in time?
- 2. From whose point(s) of view is the story told?
- 3. Is there anything in the story that wouldn't happen in real life?
- In 1-4 words -What was the story was about?
 (e.g. friendship or greed or different kinds of bravery...)

EVALUATING

- 1. Which characters do you admire? Why?
- 2. How does the author hold (or lose) your attention?
- 3. Do you like the way the story ended? Why/why not?
- 4. Does the author help you understand <u>all</u> the characters' actions?
- 5. Are any of the characters very simple or stereotyped? If so, in what ways?

CREATING

- If you could give the story a different title, what would it be?
- 2. Imagine a different ending for the story.
- 3. Create a new character for the story. How would this change what happens in the story?
- 4. Design something that would help the main character in the story?
- 5. Write an epilogue about what happens to the characters after the book ends.
