Stage 4: Pupil moved to partner class with work

Stage 5: Escalate to member of SMT, break time in the quiet area

Stage 6: Escalate to HT



#### TIMELINE (TBC)

- EARLY OCTOBER- Initial letter sent out with your designated catchment school based on your address
- EARLY NOVEMBER Out of catchment requests online form becomes available - contact us if problems
- Around November Secondary open evenings are held-keep an eye out, check websites of local high schools!
- LATE DECEMBER Closing date for non-catchment forms
- MARCH Placements and out of catchment requests announcedappeal process available
- MAY/JUNE- Enhanced transition programmes can begin
- LATE JUNE CEC 3-day transition visits to secondary school
