Interdisciplinary Learning

The theme for our IDL this term is 'Our World'. P4 will be engaging in a range of learning experience that focus on how we can protect the environment. We will be looking at renewable energy sources, locally produced food and the role of human impact on our world.

Outdoor Learning

Discrete Subjects

Maths & Numeracy - This term we will be focusing on fractions as well as revising some key areas of whole number that pupils are finding tricky. We will once again be encouraging pupils to take time to learn their multiplication and division tables both in class and in their own time. For topic maths, P4 will continue their measure, angles and money topic this term.

Literacy - We will continue to have weekly short burst writing sessions as we believe these have been very beneficial to the children's creative writing skills. Also, we will be having a non-fiction focus (persuasive writing) for our Talk 4 Writing block. This will link to our IDL focusing on how to protect the environment where children will be creating persuasive posters.

Meta Skills - As a year group, we will continue to embed meta skills across the curriculum.

Youth Music Initiative - Both primary 4 classes will be starting a block of in person ukelele lessons with the Youth Music Initiative from the week beginning Monday 18th May.

Chance to Shine Cricket - Cricket Scotland will be returning to offer some more sessions to our primary 4 pupils as many of their lessons in the last block were cut short.

PE - Please remember to send your child to school with an appropriate gym kit on the days they have PE. P4b have PE on Tuesday, P4a have PE on Wednesday.
