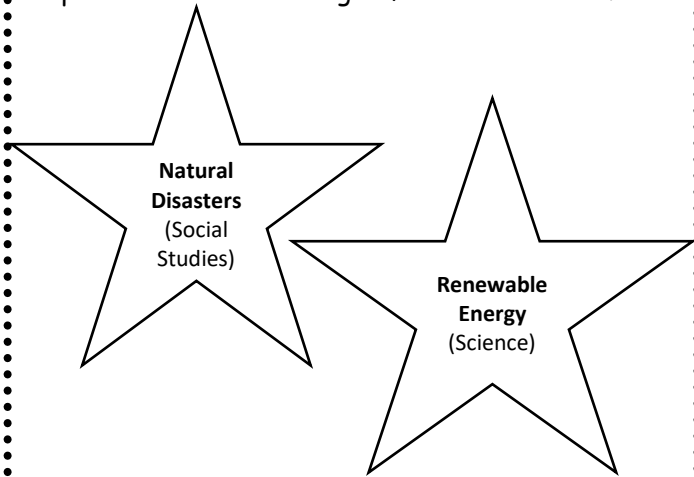


P6 – Term 4 Newsletter

Interdisciplinary Learning

This block P6 will be learning through a variety of contexts, each topic will be led by an area of the curriculum with lots of opportunities to foster links across our learning; developing skills and experiences across a range of curricular areas.



Discrete Subjects

Maths & Numeracy - This term, we will be focusing on Money, Time and Measure. Alongside this, pupils will work to develop their mental agility and problem solving strategies.

Literacy - This term we will continue to develop our tools for literacy in reading, as well as listening and talking activities. In writing, we are learning to write a biography focusing on developing understanding of structure and paragraphs as well as developing their use of grammar such as past tense, time openers and adverbial clauses. We will also focus on imaginative writing concentrating on writing for a specific audience.

Health and Wellbeing - At school we will continue to teach the tools needed to develop resilience through the 'Building Resilience' Programme. This term's focus is 'Make a Difference'. We will also be continuing our RSHP programme. This term we will look at the following topics through age-appropriate lessons and discussions: A fair and equal life for girls and boys, Social media and popular culture, Protecting me/Abuse and relationships, How people have sex/what do they do? How human life begins and Being a parent/carer.

RME - This term we will continue to investigate the beliefs and practices of Buddhism.

Music and Drama - This term we will continue to develop our skills in Music and Drama with Miss Mooney and Mrs Murray.

Spanish - We will continue to develop our Spanish skills with Ms Hepburn. This term we will begin exploring seasons, time, feelings, body parts and food.

PE

This term, P6 will continue to attend P.E sessions with Mrs Bertram, with a focus on developing skills in athletics and rugby. They will also continue their cricket sessions lead by the 'Chance to Shine' coach as well as concentrating on Fitness with their class teacher. P6a's PE days continue to be Monday and Tuesday. P6b's PE days have moved to Tuesday and Friday.
